COMMUNITY LEGAL EDUCATION is concerned with raising awareness about the ALS, the law and the legal system. Community Legal Education helps people to avoid legal problems, find a way to resolve their legal problems, and assists people to know their legal rights.

The ALS Community Legal Education program is aimed at members of the Aboriginal community in NSW and ACT. This includes high school and TAFE students, young adults, adults, community groups, community workers, and people who work in other organisations including service providers, Aboriginal organisations and Government Departments.

ALS Community Legal Education activities include:

- giving information to a person, a group or an organisation about the ALS
- providing information about legal issues, how the system of law works, and how to access the ALS
- handing out ALS publications including Brochures, Fact Sheets, DVD's, Annual Report
- holding a stall for the ALS at an event or gathering
- attending community, interagency and service provider meetings as a representative of the ALS
- speaking at education forums for young people
- building relationships and partnerships with other service

providers including at meetings and events, and in the delivery of Community Legal Education

- talking to a group, giving a paper or doing a presentation at an event, meeting or conference
- emailing local community and stakeholders with information about the ALS and legal-related information
